MODERATOR'S REPORT

Dear Friends:

On November 18th, 2018 The Ecclesiastical society of East Haddam, Connecticut, First Church of Christ, Congregational of East Haddam, Connecticut voted, unanimously, to become an Open and Affirming Church adopting the following covenant.

First Church of Christ, Congregational in East Haddam, a congregation of the United Church of Christ, is created to provide a place for all people to worship God, serve God and humanity, and grow in faith and fellowship. All persons are created in God's image and are loved, valued, and blessed equally by God. This community of faith is an open and affirming congregation who seeks to welcome all persons, including those of all races, ethnicities, ages, sexual orientations, gender identities and expressions, family structures, faith backgrounds, abilities and economic circumstances. All persons are invited to fully share and participate in leadership, ministry, fellowship, worship, sacraments, responsibilities, blessings and joys of our church family

The words of the adopted covenant send a powerful message of love and hope.

As we are called by our savior, Jesus Christ to act as His servants in the world and within our church, spreading a message of love, acceptance and reconciliation, we must be a beacon of hope to heal our world.

The United Church of Christ adopted a resolution calling on UCC Congregations to covenant as Open and Affirming. Our Church Council voted, unanimously, to recommend that First Church of Christ, Congregational vote in congregational meeting to covenant as an Open and Affirming Church.

An Open and Affirming Church is a great idea, but more importantly, it is a great idea whose time has come.

The Apostle Paul said that, as Christians, we are many members with different gifts, but we are one body in Christ (Rom. 12:4) and Jesus calls us to love our neighbors as ourselves (Mk. 12:31) without being judgmental (Mt. 7:1-2) nor disparaging of others (Lk. 18:9-14).

The Bible affirms and celebrates human expressions of love and partnership, calling us to live out fully that gift of God in responsible, faithful,

committed relationships that recognize and respect the image of God in all people. By covenanting as an Open and Affirming Church, we have affirmed the most basic of all human rights-- the right to belong to Christ's church – of all people:

Young and old;

Abled and disabled;

Healthy and infirm;

Regardless of their gender identity or sexual orientation.

A Letter from The Board of Trustees For Support of the Raise the Roof Campaign

Dear Members and Friends of First Church,

The Board of Trustees is asking for your help to build the Raise the Roof fund, which will be the foundation of our restoration projects at First Church – starting with replacement of the Parish Hall roof in the spring.

A generous bequest by Robert Drouin and a state grant from the Connecticut Historic Preservation Office, allowed us to commission and complete a comprehensive assessment of our church buildings and operating systems earlier this year.

With that plan in place, we can begin to address our most pressing projects and seek state and other grant assistance to help us with the substantial costs. State grants operate on a reimbursement basis, meaning we need to pay for and complete the work to historic preservation standards, before any payment can be made.

We estimate that \$50,000 is needed before we can put the roof replacement project to bid. Generous memorial gifts and fundraising have started us down the path. Your contributions are needed to help reach that goal.

Please consider a contribution. We will be reaching out to the community as part of a larger capital campaign to help restore our iconic Meeting House. But we need to start first with our own congregation to raise all we can.

The trustees will keep the congregation informed about the progress of fundraising and restoration projects. We welcome your suggestions and your assistance as we begin this critical and necessary work.


We sew from 9:30am and between setting up and guests until about noon.

Fill the East Haddam Fuel Bank Saturday!

Saturday November 17th from 9:00am to Noon members of First Church braved the cold winds and held a town wide collection to <u>Fill the East Haddam Fuel Bank</u>. We covered five locations - East Haddam Transfer Station, Grist Mill Market, Two Wrasslin Cats, Shagbark Lumber & Farm Supplies and First Church and in *just three hours, collected* <u>\$1080.19.</u>

The East Haddam Emergency Fuel Bank was established in 1977 by the East Haddam Public Health Nursing Board and the East Haddam Council of Churches, neither of which exist today. First Church (First Ecclesiastical Society of East Haddam, Connecticut) volunteered to act as the sponsoring charity for this fund and continues in that capacity. Dr. Karl P. Stofko, former treasurer of First Church and clerk of the Board of Public Health Nursing Board of the Town of East Haddam in 1977, has acted as treasurer and manager of this fund since its inception.
