Wednesday, November 15<sup>th</sup> Faith, Food and Family 6:00-7:30 Join us!


### Volunteers Needed for New Committee To Explore An Inclusive First Church.

Many of us are doing our winter preparation, getting our homes ready for the cold winds, snow and ice, keeping Old Man Winter out and keeping it warm and cozy inside. But despite these efforts, some of our neighbors may come up short with the finances to heat their home.

East Haddam Emergency Fuel Bank is a non-profit organization that can benefit these East Haddam families in times of need. Assistance is awarded via referral through: Youth and Family Services (Toni McCabe 860-873-3296), or Energy Assistance (Brad Parker – East Haddam Senior Center 860-873-5034)

Funding for the Fuel Bank comes from tax-deductible financial donations from area churches, community organizations and individuals just like you. And your help is needed now to ensure that the funds are available when assistance is needed.

Saturday November 18<sup>th</sup> volunteers are needed from 9:00 am to Noon at the following locations: East Haddam Transfer Station, Grist Mill Market, Two Wrasslin Cats and Shagbark Lumber & Farm Supplies and at our church. The youth group will continue efforts to fill the bank from 12:30-2:30pm in front of First Church.

The East Haddam Emergency Fuel Bank was established in 1977 by the East Haddam Public Health Nursing Board and the East Haddam Council of Churches, neither of which exist today. First Church (First Ecclesiastical Society of East Haddam, Connecticut) volunteered to act as the sponsoring charity for this fund and continues in that capacity. Dr. Karl P. Stofko, former treasurer of First Church and clerk of the Board of Public Health Nursing Board of the Town of East Haddam in 1977, has acted as treasurer and manager of this fund since its inception.

The Monday Morning Guys are a group of gentlemen who love this church and lovingly maintain it. Their numbers are getting smaller and they need some new blood!


